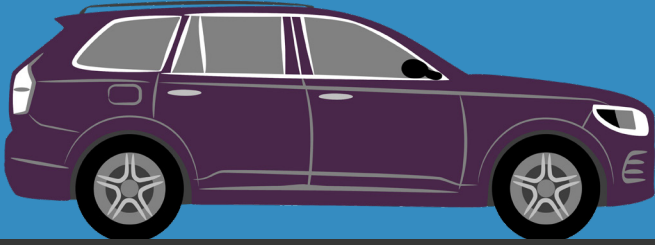


AF Vehicle Exemption

When a client claims that they use a vehicle as their primary home, the use reason for this vehicle must be set to 'Used as Household's home'. This vehicle will be exempt as a Primary Residence.



See the examples below to help you determine when a vehicle should be set to 'Used as Household's home' and when vehicles will be countable/exempt.

Harold and Hilda are on the case. Harold owns a van; his wife a car. They use the van as their primary residence.

- Van: This vehicle is exempt as their primary residence. Select 'Yes' for HH Home.
- Car: This vehicle is exempt as their primary vehicle. Select 'No' for HH Home.

Ramon and Rachel are on the case. They own an RV that they use more than their apartment.

- RV: This vehicle is countable. Select 'No' for HH Home.

Jason and Jaylen are on the case. They live in their RV because they have nowhere else to go.

- RV: This vehicle is exempt as their primary residence. Select 'Yes' for HH Home.

Adalino and Arsenio are married. Adalino owns an RV that the couple uses as a home. Arsenio also owns an RV that currently they don't use.

- RV #1: This vehicle is exempt as their primary residence. Select 'Yes' for HH Home.
- RV #2: This vehicle is countable. Select 'No' for HH Home.

Nessa, Nino, and their sponsor Nomar are on the case. Nessa and Nino live in their SUV and have no home. Nino also owns an RV that they only use to have fun. Nessa and Nomar also own a car each.

- SUV: This vehicle is exempt as their primary residence. Select 'Yes' for HH Home.
- RV: This vehicle is countable. Select 'No' for HH Home.
- Car #1: This vehicle is exempt as their primary vehicle. Select 'No' for HH Home.
- Car #2: This vehicle is countable. Select 'No' for HH Home.

Bill is the HOH and applies for AF. He owns a van and a car (Value \$5,000). Beatrice, his wife, lives with him in his van. Beatrice owns an RV (Value \$12,000), which they don't use.

- Van: This vehicle is exempt as their primary residence. Select 'Yes' for HH Home.
- Car: This vehicle is exempt as their primary vehicle. Select 'No' for HH Home.
- RV: This vehicle is countable. Select 'No' for HH Home.



- Willow and Winona are married. Willow’s RV has an FMV of \$10,000, which they use to live; Winona owns a car. Winona also owns an RV with FMV of \$15,000 that they don’t use.
- RV #1: This vehicle is exempt as their primary residence. Select ‘Yes’ for HH Home.
 - Car: This vehicle is exempt as their primary vehicle. Select ‘No’ for HH Home.
 - RV #2: This vehicle is countable. Select ‘No’ for HH Home.

‘Inoperable/Not Running’

When a client claims that their vehicle does not work, you will be able to set the vehicle as ‘Inoperable/Not Running’ under the ‘Vehicle Use’ related list under the ‘Vehicle Summary’ page.
