

SNAP Rescind, Reinstatement, Reopen

Rescind

Performed to reverse a case closure/denial

- At application and Late RRR - IF verification is returned prior to day 30 of the **PACKET RECEIVED DATE** (not the RRR due month)
- At timely/untimely RRR, IF verification is returned prior to RRR due date
- When a PRF is received in the 13th month
- To fix an incorrect denial
- If county took untimely action and benefits are due to client back to app date

Reinstatement

Allows SNAP clients to re-establish eligibility after a mid-cert closure without having to reapply

- Can be used only for cases closed mid-certification
- Client submitted verification in an attempt to re-establish eligibility
- Benefits are prorated from date verification was received
- Reinstatement is used
 1. If at least 1 month of benefits is both:
 - a. Received prior to the closure, even if that month was prorated
 - b. Remaining in the existing cert period
 2. When verification was received within 30 calendar days after the mid-cert closure date
 3. If discontinuation of benefits did not occur while receiving T-SNAP

Reopen

Used to process late verifications for apps or RRRs without using AI or rescind

- Can be used at app or RRR
- Late verifications are received after a case was denied for failure to provide verification
- Benefits are prorated from the date late verifications were received
- Reopen is used:
 1. If late verification are received after a case was denied for failure to provide verification
 2. At app and late RRR when late verifications are received between 31 and 60 days of submission
 3. For timely/untimely RRRs when late verifications are received within 30 days of the RRR due date
 4. After existing compliance reasons in CBMS are resolved
 - * Do not use individual compliance if the case had not returned verification; let the system fail instead to allow “reopen” logic
