
- At intake: CBMS will auto-deny on day 30.
- At RRR: CBMS will auto-deny/discontinue after due date, plus 3 days. User can run RRR verification after due date to deny earlier.
- A new case comment will auto-generate when a SNAP case (Regular) SNAP, EXSNAP, and T-SNAP) is discontinued for not providing the required verification:

- If your household has applied for SSI or Colorado Works benefits and you are approved for one of these programs, you may be eligible to receive SNAP. Contact your county worker to find out more about how you may qualify for SNAP.
- If your household circumstances have changed but your SNAP benefits have been discontinued, you can provide proof of the change within 30 days from the date your benefits stopped. Your local office will use this proof to determine if your benefits can continue.
